## Jacmel Haiti

### HISTORY

Jacmel is one of the many gems that you will discover in Haiti. Once called the pearl of the Caribbean, this incredible and diversified historical treasure is now center stage for a major revitalization project currently under way. This website has been created to showcase the real Haiti that most people have never imagined. By tourists visiting Jacmel, all kinds of new industries will breed in the region. The governing thesis being advancement of the Haitian people through employment, healthcare, education and permanent housing. It will re-establish the historical relevance of Jacmel as a commerce and tourist center, thus providing a sustainable socio-economic system for thousands of Haitians. This model will bring hope and a future to the people of Haiti.

Jacmel founded in 1698 has a distinguished history of economic and cultural prosperity. A prominent center for trade and commerce, Jacmel was once a significant port for the exportation of coffee and precious oils. Today, Jacmel is considered by many to be the cultural capital of Haiti. Known for its distinctive artistic traditions, Jacmel has produced some of Haiti's best-known painters, writers and poets. With its rich cultural scene, Jacmel is one of the major production centers for indigenous arts and crafts.

Jacmel is a place apart from the rest of the country. Known for its French colonial architecture, the town has maintained a distinctive, Old World charm. Beautiful beaches and unique hotels draw Haitians and foreigners alike to Jacmel for calm and relaxation. In fact, Jacmel's urban and architectural design is credited with having influenced New Orleans' French Quarter which was modeled on the center of town of Jacmel. Today Jacmel has been tentatively accepted as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The quality of life, services and infrastructure in Jacmel maintain a climate of general peace and stability not easily found in other parts of the nation. These factors make it the most dynamic and interesting place to begin to comprehend this often-misunderstood nation. Jacmel is host to the most academically progressive French Lycee in the nation and celebrates a popular carnival renowned for its artistic uniqueness each year. Jacmel is Haiti's fifth largest city, with an estimated population of 60,000.

Jacmel, (*Jakmèl* in Kréyòl) also known by its indigenous Taíno name of *Yaquimel*, is a town in southern Haiti founded in 1698. It is the capital of the department of Sud-Est and has an estimated population of 40,000, while the municipality (commune) of Jacmel had a population of 137,966 at the 2003 Census.

The buildings are historic and date from the early nineteenth century; the town has been tentatively accepted as a World Heritage site and UNESCO reports that it has sustained damage in the 2010 Haiti earthquake
